

Dr Livesley is Professor Emeritus in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of British Columbia, Canada. His research focuses on the structure, classification, and origins of personality disorder, and on constructing an integrated framework for describing and conceptualizing personality pathology. His clinical interests are directed toward developing a unified approach to treatment. Dr Livesley is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada and a co-editor of the Journal of Personality Disorders.

Dr Livesley has published a number of books that provide the most creative and innovative contributions in many years to the conceptualization, understanding and treatment of personality disorders.

John Livesley's important work on effective practice with people who struggle with serious emotional problems provided the original template for Leeds Personality Disorder Services and we are pleased to welcome him back in Leeds.

Course Outline

This course will describe a unified trans-theoretical, trans-diagnostic model for treating personality disorder and related conditions that combines strategies and interventions used by all effective therapies. The rationale for such an approach is based on evidence of similar outcomes across the different therapies and extensive co-occurrence among personality disorder diagnoses. The course will offer a framework for understanding the nature of personality disorder, variations in clinical presentation and describe the relationship with other disorders, including complex trauma syndromes.
