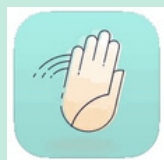




CHAPTER FOUR: EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES FOR DEAF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

- **BSL Education App**: an app with science and maths terminology and including definitions in BSL.



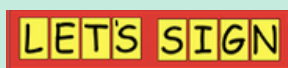

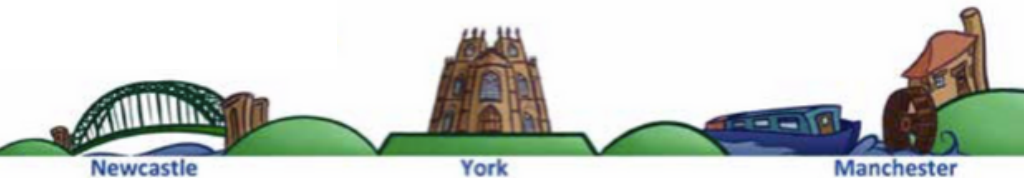
